Your Doctor has asked for a blood test and some blood to be taken from you



We will put a pillow under your arm and we will put a strap on your arm. It will feel tight



This is what will be used to take your blood



This is what your arm will look like



We may have to hold you so you don't move during the test



We may wipe your arm with a wet pad

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We then put the needle in your arm
You may feel this, but we will talk to you all the time



This is what it will look like



We put a bottle on the needle to collect the blood



We will put cotton wool on your arm and pull the needle out



We then undo the strap



We will press on your arm



We will put a plaster on your arm.



At a later time You will see your doctor for the results
